PARIS INTERNATIONALE ANNOUNCES ITS EXHIBITORS LIST

The fifth edition of Paris Internationale will take place between October 16 and October 20 at 16, rue Alfred de Vigny, in the eight arrondissement of Paris. The professional preview will take place on October 15.

Throughout the years, Paris Internationale established itself as a new model in the ecosystem of international contemporary art fairs. Forward thinking and collaborative, free spirited and audacious, the non-profit fair was founded in 2015 on the initiative of five galleries. Since its creation, the fair offers a rich selection of cutting-edge artistic projects presented by galleries from around the world.

On the occasion of its fifth edition, Paris Internationale invited 42 galleries coming from 14 countries. Alongside the founding galleries, Antoine Levi (Paris), Crèvecoeur (Paris), Gregor Staiger (Zurich), Sultana (Paris), the galleries Bodega (New York), Carlos/Ishikawa (London), Croy Nielsen (Vienna), Deborah Schamoni (Munich), Koppe Astner (Glasgow), and Union Pacific (London) have been participating since the inaugural edition and renewed their support to the fair this year again.







Paris Internationale is also happily confirming the participation of BQ (Berlin), Emalin (London), Federico Vavassori (Milan), KOW (Berlin), Max Mayer (Dusseldorf), Misako & Rosen (Tokyo), mother's tankstation limited (Dublin | London), Öktem Aykut (Istanbul), Park View / Paul Soto (Los Angeles), Project Native Informant (London), ROH Projects (Jakarta), Southard Reid (London), Tanya Leighton (Berlin), Temnikova & Kasela (Tallinn), Wschód (Warsaw) and XYZ Collective (Tokyo).

Following the open-call to non-profit organisations placed last May, over 150 applications were diligently reviewed and eight spaces were extended an invitation to participate: 650mAh (Hove), 1856 (Melbourne), Full-Fall (Milan), Goswell Road (Paris), La Plage (Paris), Sang Bleu (London), Shivers Only (Paris), Tirana Art Center (Tirana).

The library and media section will be managed by Paris Ass Book Fair.

The public programs of Paris Internationale 2019 are conceived by the Berlin based non-profit organisation The Performance Agency. A detailed schedule of events will be announced in September. Access to these programs is free of charge and open to all.

Essentially nomadic, Paris Internationale is exceptionally settling down for the time of its fifth edition in the venue which was home to its 2018 edition. Galleries will invest the four floors of this Hausmannian building, close to the Grand Palais, at 16 rue Alfred de Vigny. As they progress through this intimate and welcoming mansion overlooking Parc Monceau, visitors will encounter a variety of experimental artistic projects. A gathering place to exchange ideas, Paris Internationale is further developing its support of a young generation of galleries and artists.

PHILOSOPHY

Founded in 2015, Paris Internationale is a contemporary art fair for a younger generation of galleries encouraging the work of emerging artists. It was rapidly confirmed as a staple of the contemporary art month in October in Paris.

Collegial and associative, Paris Internationale was born out of a will to take control of its own future and to propose an exclusive event in Paris. Far from the rigid organization of more classical fairs, Paris Internationale operates on a small committee. Its structure is dynamic and reactive, allowing for a maximal liberty.

The philosophy of Paris Internationale is articulated around three principles:

- To propose affordable spaces and therefore encourage the exhibitors to present audacious projects.
- To attract the most interesting protagonists of a younger generation of galleries in Paris.
- To deconstruct the traditional codes of art fairs by anchoring the project in an outstanding context within Paris' city center
